- 4. Woodland pools and swamps are breeding mosquitoes and there seems to be plenty of water for breeding. Doing larviciding; have found 1st and 2nd instar and a few 3rd instar; BTI doing an excellent job. Water management jobs progressing okay; finished a job in Leominster. Had a difference of opinion with Conservation Commission but job was completed. Members of Conservation Commissions sometimes are not fully acquainted with the legal procedures followed by mosquito control personnel.
- 5. Town of Harvard voted to get out of our project.
- 6. Carlisle is voting on getting into our project at Town Meeting on May 1st.
- 7. Wilmington is voting on getting into our project at Town Meeting on April 22nd.
- 8. Acton, which voted out of our program several years ago, cut money for larviciding and left money for adulticiding "a reverse attack". Any money should be spent on larviciding.
- 9. Mr. Charles Costa has been placed on Reclamation Board representing the Dept. of Food & Agriculture.
- 10. David Scott and his group did an excellent job hosting the AMCA for the 1989; despite the poor weather everything went well. Next AMCA meeting to be held in Louisville, Kentucky.
