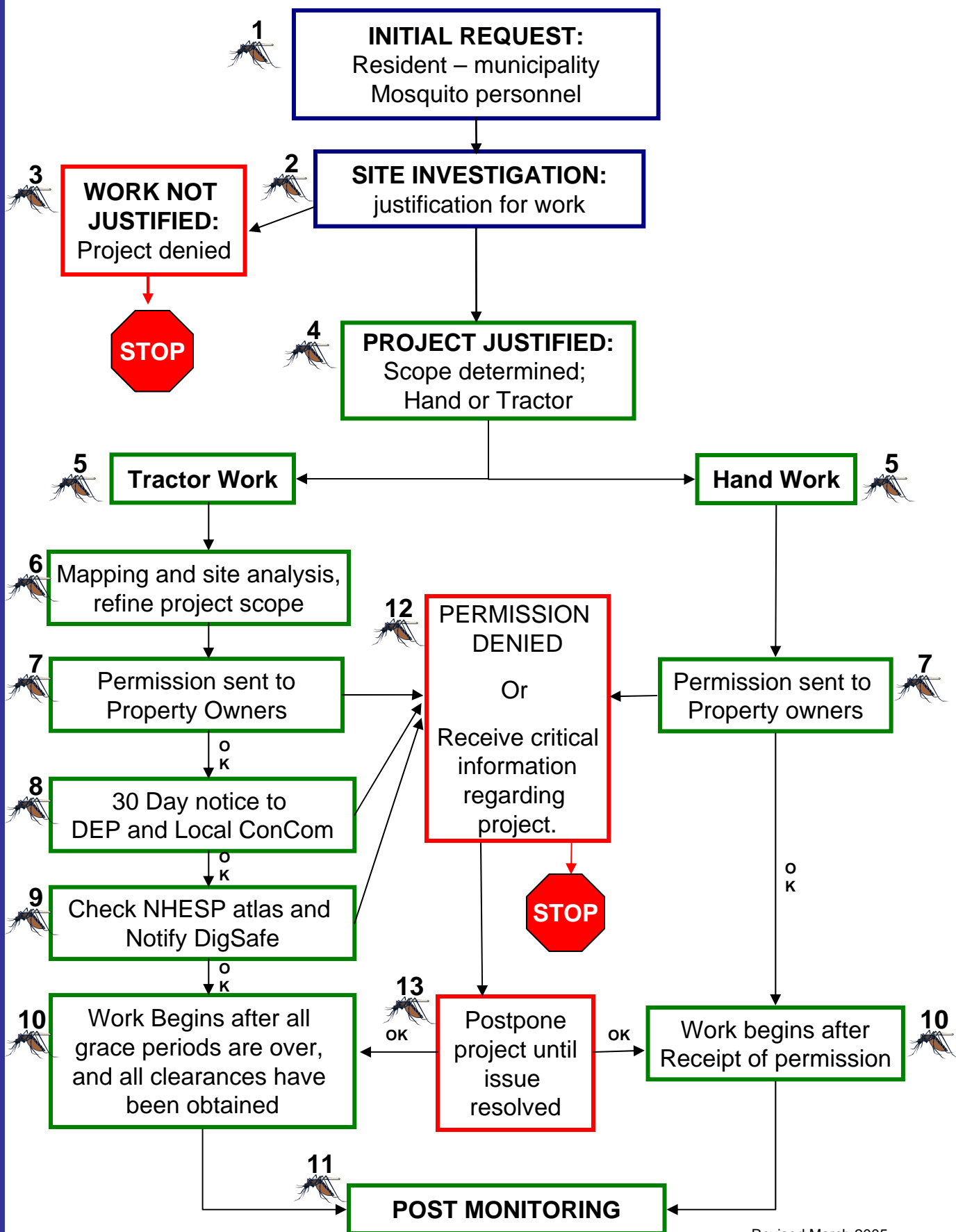

















CMMCP WETLANDS RESTORATION FLOW CHART





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EXPLANATION SHEET

-  1 **INITIAL REQUEST:** Requests are received from property owners, municipal contacts, or CMMCP field personnel.
-  2 **SITE INVESTIGATION:** Justification for work will be based upon existing or potential mosquito breeding sites, or ongoing maintenance of CMMCP projects. Justification will take field conditions and engineering deficiencies into account.
-  3 **WORK NOT JUSTIFIED:** If a project cannot be justified, or if work is not feasible due to logistical concerns, then there will be no restoration project.
-  4 **PROJECT JUSTIFIED:** After it has been determined that the project can be done, the scope of work will be determined. Tractor work and hand work will be determined based upon field conditions, site restrictions, and project need.
-  5 **TRACTOR WORK vs. HAND WORK:** There are two separate tracks for project set-up depending upon the type of project that will be completed. Hand work requires less field survey and fewer notifications to outside agencies.
-  6 **MAPPING AND SITE ANALYSIS:** For tractor work, additional survey work is completed to determine the appropriate depth, width, and length of the project.
-  7 **PERMISSION:** Permission to access property is obtained from all property owners prior to commencement of work.
-  8 **30 DAY NOTIFICATIONS:** DEP and the local ConCom are provided a 30 day grace period to notify CMMCP of any concerns prior to tractor work.
-  9 **NHESP, DigSafe:** The NHESP atlas is checked to make sure that the project is not in any Estimated or Priority endangered species habitat. DigSafe is notified to obtain utility clearances.
-  10 **WORK BEGINS:** After all permission slips are obtained and clearances are obtained from outside agencies, work may commence.
-  11 **POST MONITORING:** The site will be monitored for 1 year to observe site recovery, and will be monitored every 3-5 years thereafter to determine the need for future maintenance.
-  12 **PROJECT ISSUES:** Sometimes property owners deny access to their property, or inform CMMCP of issues related to the project that may not have been known when the project was set up. The project may then be cancelled or postponed.
-  13 **PROJECT POSTPONED:** If there are outstanding issues, the project may be postponed until all issues or conditions are resolved.
